Little Changes

On Ash Wednesday I shared a simple (but profound) math formula:

\end{array}$$

It is simply a way of illustrating the power of making small changes in our life. My question for you this Lent is: What small change in your life might result in a significant difference in your relationship with God or your relationship with others? Perhaps it is a small increase in your planned giving. Perhaps it is a small act of kindness which brings a sense of blessing to another. Perhaps it is a small change in your prayer life that renews your faith that God is working in your every day life. Whatever the case might be, I would encourage you to make some small changes in your life over these next 40 days. It might just change your world.

Help Change Our World

Each year, during the Season of Lent, we invite our congregation to participate in a special offering called Change the World. Change the World coin jars have been placed throughout our church and we ask our members to place their change in one of these jars each time they come to church for study or worship. On Maundy Thursday, during our service of Holy Communion, we will also take a special offering; all of these funds will go toward various missions projects supported by our church. It doesn't sound like a significant effort, but it amazing how small amounts of change, added to our Change the World coin jars each week, can add up to be a significant offering. We encourage everyone to be a part of this special Lenten offering.



Praying With Your Eyes Open

We invite everyone to join in our special Lenten Prayer emphasis of "praying with your eyes open" as we continue our Lenten Journey through the month of March. What we are simply asking is for our members to "look around" as they are standing, walking, driving and notice individuals or groups who might benefit from a brief prayer. School children playing on a play ground, a neighbor walking through the neighborhood, a person who appears stressed as you make your way through the store; these (and countless others) could benefit from your brief word of prayer. It is simply a way of making Paul's injunction to "pray without ceasing" a regular part of your life.

We have also prepared a Q&A Sheet with answers to frequently asked questions for which we have certain answers. These too can be found on the table in the foyer.

Please continue in your prayers for this team and the Church Council as they strive to discern the best way (and timing) for our congregation to proceed.
